Description:	The Colorado Commission for the Deaf, Hard of Hearing, and DeafBlind's (CCDHHDB) Communications Technology Program (CTP) is a state program that provides FREE telecommunication devices, such as amplified and captioned phones and wireless devices as well as accessories (ring signalers and neck loops or headsets) and specialized equipment to qualified deaf, hard of hearing and deaf-blind. The program wants to match the right tool for the individual to ensure the person uses it to the fullest capacity. The equipment itself gives the person independence and accessibility to family and the community at large.
Eligibility:	CTP provides equipment at no charge to those that are deaf, hard of hearing or deafblind, whose household income is at or below 300% of the Federal Poverty Guideline, who is a resident of Colorado and who has home or cellular phone service.
