• WHO: The city of Aurora is working in collaboration with the Metro Denver Homeless Initiative (MDHI), and volunteers across the Metro Denver region to conduct an unsheltered homeless to get a one day snapshot of homeless in our community.

WHAT: The Point-in-Time (PIT) count is a survey of unsheltered homeless persons on a single night of the year to give communities an idea of the extent of homelessness in their own back yard.

WHERE: Volunteers will work with outreach teams to conduct interviews with homeless individuals and families.

WHY: The Point in Time survey is currently our best method for estimating the number of people experiencing homelessness in the Metro Denver area. Information gathered can be used to educate our community, faith-based organizations and local government entities. Many funding sources also require data obtained through the Point in Time.
