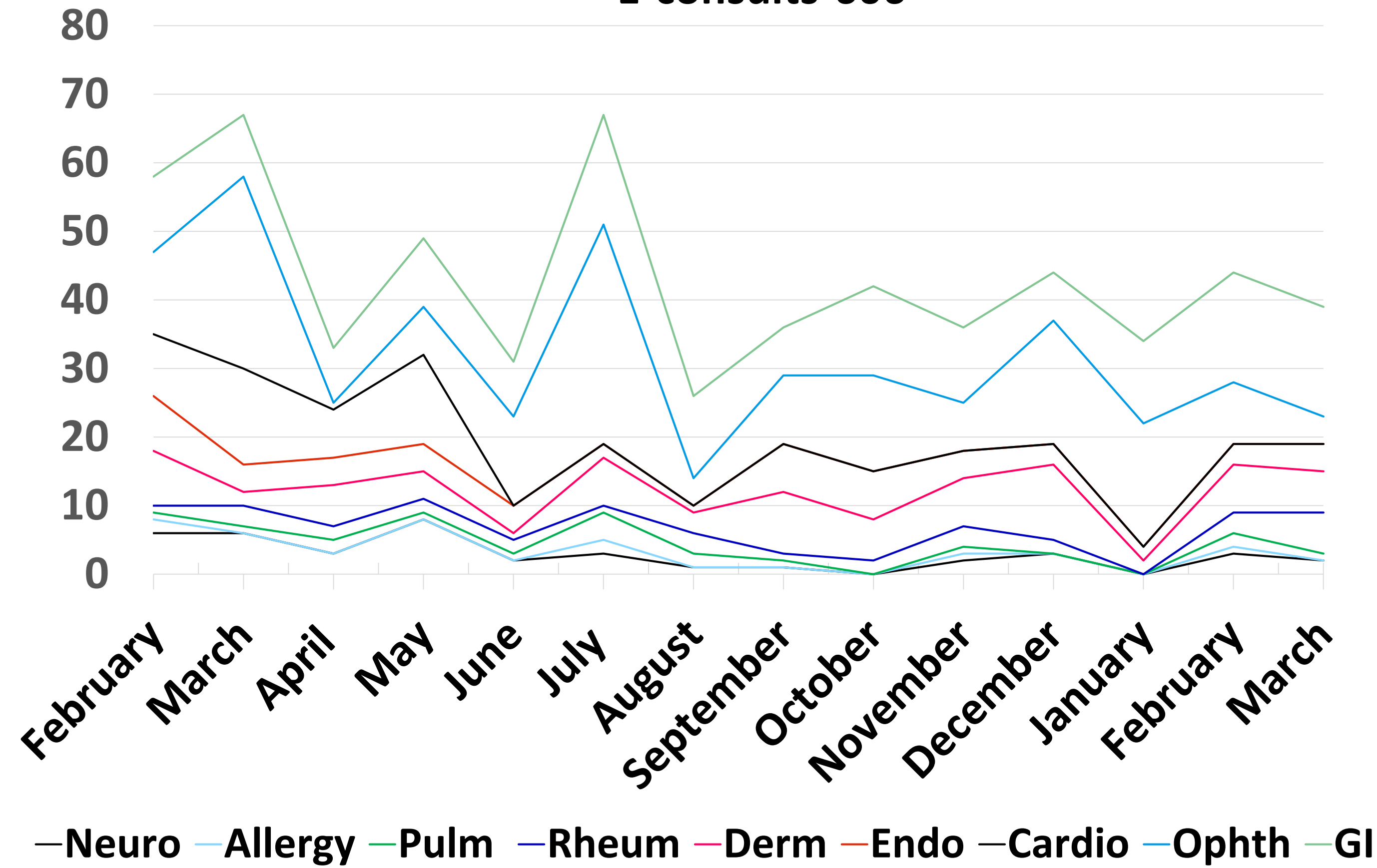


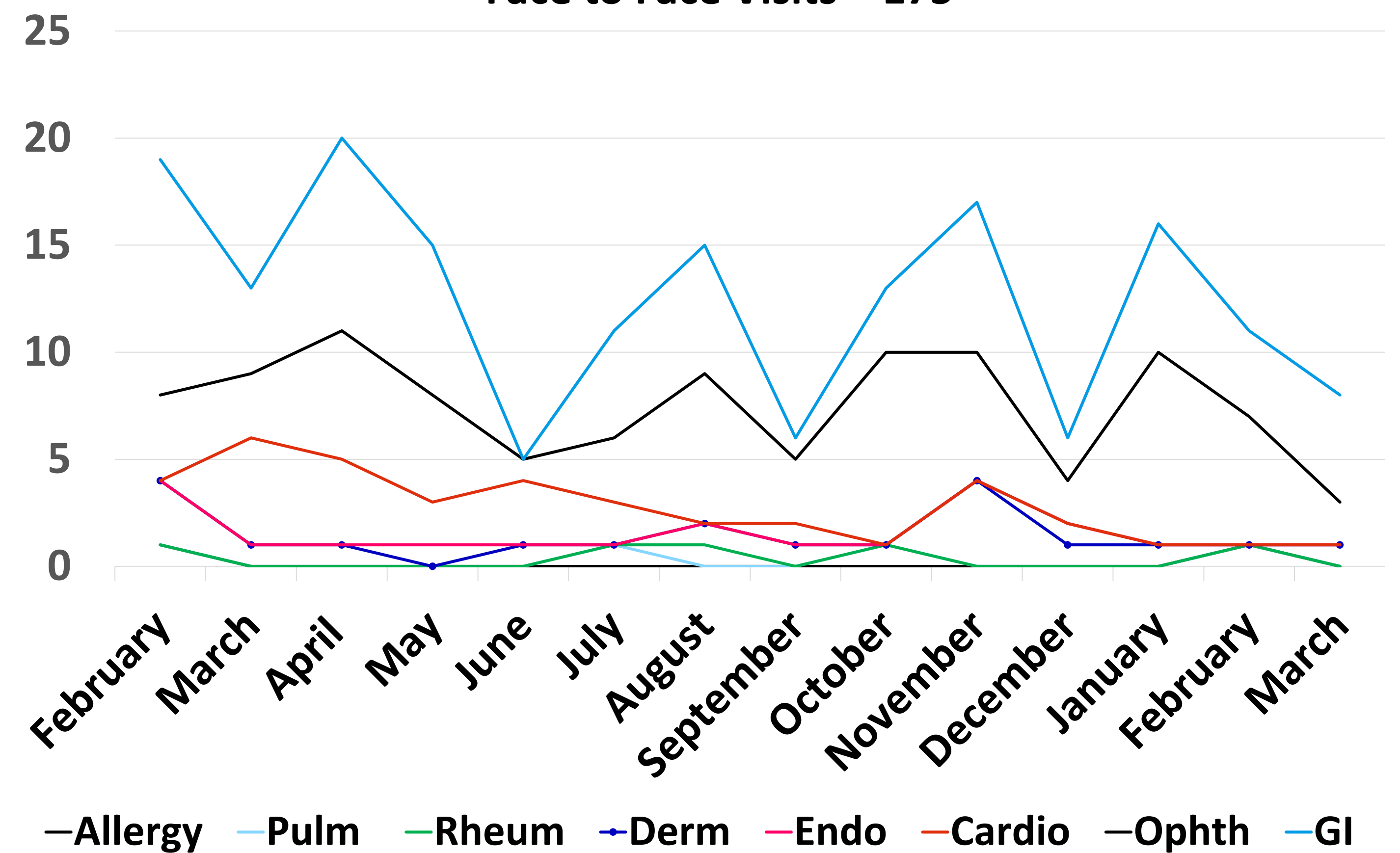
# Summary Report of Safety Net Specialty Care Program by month February 2017 – March 2018\*

Community Benefit reimburses participating specialty departments each month for their time spent responding to e-consults. Each case is reimbursed at the average department salary for a 30 minute period of time. Community Benefit also supports Kaiser Permanente's Community Medical Financial the assistance program which pays for the Program's face to face visit cost.

#### Other Community Efforts to Improve Access to Specialty Care for Underserved Populations

Kaiser Permanente Program Office has selected Specialty Care Access as a national Safety Net Partnerships core initiative. All Kaiser Permanente regions (Washington, Oregon, California, Hawaii, Georgia, Maryland, and Colorado) will be focusing on improving access to specialty care for safety net patients over the next several years. By the end of quarter 3, an e-consult vendor will be selected and initially offered to regions that do not have an established platform. The goal is to support 750 thousand e-consults across all Kaiser Permanente regions in the next five years. Dr. Chris Fellenz and Lynnette Namba serve as key advisors in the development of the national core initiative.

KPCO has been participating in a group committed to providing leadership, time and other resources to launch a statewide specialty care safety net in the coming years and to continue to support its growth and sustainability. Dr. Margaret Ferguson, Roland Lyon, Dr. Jandel Allen-Davis, Jim Beaudry, and Amy Pulver serve as KPCO representatives.

Kaiser Permanente Colorado announced it would fund a 1 million dollar grants to four local nonprofit organizations to encourage collaboration and increase access to specialty care for the communities they serve. Over a three-year period, the grantees will use the funding to develop and pilot a connected system that allows organizations to coordinate with one another—exploring the possibilities of sharing patient information, using technology for easier care access, and working to provide more access to specialty care for their patients.
