

Uninsured Rate in Children








Hispanic/Latinx Children Are More Likely to Be Uninsured

Uninsured Rate (Ages 0-18)








Colorado Children Lacking Citizenship Are More Likely to be **Uninsured**

Uninsured Rate (Ages 0-18)








Colorado Children with Lower Incomes Are More Likely to be Uninsured








Self-Reported Health Status in Children


Fair or Poor General Health Status (Ages 0-18)







More Children Have Dental Insurance and are Visiting the Dentist












Denver Residents Have Higher Rates of Barriers Related to Paying Medical Bills

Problem Paying Medical Bills (All Ages)








More Unstable Housing in the Denver Metro Area

Unstable Housing (All Ages)








Higher Rates of Food Insecurity

Food Insecurity (All Ages)









Poor Mental Health Among Children (Ages 0-18)









Behavioral Health Access is Down


